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Annamma C. John Promoted to Glory

Annamma John was promoted to glory on the 25th of September 2018 after a prolonged illness. She was the Founder-Editor of Christian Woman which she began about ten years ago. She was also the co-founder and a director of Good News Ministries established at Trivandrum, India in 1978 under the auspices of Baptist Mid-Missions. She had composed more than 150 spiritual songs and made eleven CD albums. Of the eleven CDs, the last three, God is My Helper, The Lord of Calvary and The Compassionate God were composed while she was bedridden. She wrote articles on current issues and had been a critic of the laxity shown by believers in matters pertaining to faith, morality, doctrinal stand and Christian ethics. Her funeral service was held under the auspices of the First Baptist Church of Trivandrum at the Good News Worship Center on the 29 th of September 2018 in the presence of a large crowd of people from all walks of life. Brother Chandapilla Philip, a renowned preacher among the fundamental circle, Bro. Roy Mathew, a former Good News staff worker and well- known Bible



teacher and Bro. Jayaraj N, the acting pastor of the First Baptist Church of Trivandrum led the service. Rev. Jonathan Victor, Field president of the India Field Council of Baptist Mid-Missions represented Baptist Mid-Missions. Annamma and her husband Dr. Charles John had been missionaries under the Baptist Mid-Missions for the past 44 years. Among several others, Charles and his son Pramod and Charles' brother George John spoke on the occasion. Her mortal remains were laid to rest in the First Baptist Church cemetery on the afternoon of the 29th of September 2018 (I Thess. 4:16).

Along with Apostle Paul we can affirm that she was never ashamed of the gospel of Jesus Christ. When she was able to walk, she reached out to the unreached. When she was bedridden, she still proclaimed the gospel to the unreached who came to her. Her life was a life well lived for the glory of God.

We thank the Lord for her life and labor for the furtherance of the gospel unto the uttermost to her last breath. She remains in the hearts of literally thousands as a paragon to emulate. Along with Apostle Paul she too can claim the verse: I have fought the good fight. I have finished the course. I have kept the faith (II Tim. 4:7). To God be the glory.

She is known for her genuineness, simplicity, humility and was always very warm in welcoming guests. She was simple in her dealings, and I always appreciated that. She loved her country and she wanted to serve her people until her last breath, and God fulfilled her desire. Once she told me she doesn't want to live anywhere but in India. The reason was to serve God in her own country as much as possible. As we have heard she edited a magazine and composed many songs and if you listen to the lyrics we can understand how close she was with God and how she loved God. She also took care of the family, the family of God here and faithfully took care of any responsibility that was given to her. She fondly served Christ who saved her.

Life is a gift for us from God and she gave her life back to God. That is the best gift you can give to God. As God gives us life, giving our life back to God is the best gift for Him. Death for a believer is the final best promotion to the best place. Apostle Paul in Phil. 1:21 affirms that "to live is Christ and to die is gain". I recall in May of this year, when Susan and I were there, that the last vital signs check right before dad went to bed, alerted him so that she could be rushed to the emergency room.

There are so many other qualities and talents in Mom. Her cooking was often complimented by many. She could sew or do the work of a handy man. She had the ability to discern clearly. Her ministry skills were also amazing. Mom could teach, evangelize, preach to women, write articles, write doctrinally sound and beautiful hope-filled songs. Most of her songs were about meeting the Lord and being in heaven where we are confident that she is now with her beautiful Savior about whom she sang so much about. Truly she was an all-rounder and a master of several at the same time.

My mother was known by many names -Annamma, Kunjamma, Aunty, Chechy, Song Writer, Magazine Founder, Magazine Editor, Article Writer, Director etc., but to me, she was just "Mummy" or "Mom" and that was everything she was to me.

My first memories of Mom are from when I was four years old and lying next to her in her bed, probably for a nap. I remember her asking me even at that age whether or not I wanted to go to heaven and then she would share what Christ did on the cross and ask me if I wanted to follow Him. That concern she had for my salvation, she had for everyone she met and tried to share the gospel with them. She never apologized for what she believed in and made sure her faith was known.

She was always a very loving mother, but she was also firm. She had a very deep sense of what was right and one of the things she often used to say was not to lie even if it meant losing my head. Her conviction about making sure she did the right thing was very strong and she always wanted to make sure those she touched also had the same kind of conviction. She was also a nononsense kind of person. She didn't beat around the bush or sugarcoat what she thought she should say no matter to whom it was. With that came stubbornness too. Once convinced of something, no one could change her mind unless she came to her own conclusion whether what was being said was right or wrong. There was very little that was gray to her - everything was either black or white.

Yet, she was also tender. I remember when I was younger she would see some news on TV or hear about something that happened and her compassion was immediately visible. She would

shed tears for people hundreds or thousands of miles away whom she had never met. She never turned away anyone who came to our house with any kind of need - whether it was food or clothes or money. She would try to help in some way or another.

Her strength and courage often surprised me in a society in which women were often reluctant to offer their opinions. She was very traditional in many ways and adhered to the culture, yet was nontraditional in that she worked along side dad as an equal. She taught us, her three boys, to always treat women with respect, that women had important and meaningful things to say and that women could be just as strong as men.

She wasn't tied to this world or things of this world. She gave away things on a regular basis to anyone and everyone. I remember once when we were visiting India, my wife Piya mentioned that she liked some tea cups in which we had just had afternoon tea. Without even a second thought, Mom immediately told us to take them with us and packed it for us to take back to the US. She knew well that this world was just a temporary place for her and she always looked forward to being with her Savior, just as she says in the words of one of her songs (included in this issue of the magazine on page cover 3).

Mom, I miss the warmth of your touch, the sound of your voice, the love in your eyes, the taste of the food you cooked, playing Scrabble with you and more things than I can write, but I know you are with the Jesus whom you loved. So, I will wait patiently until the day I meet you again in His presence.




















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
